This is information I received from Jack Kraft recently that I want to pass on to our OMUG folks. This concerns a part of the new iLife '08.

iMovie '08: Third-party plug-ins not compatible; Kernel panics at launch

Third-party plug-ins may not be compatible Apple said during the announcement of iMovie '08 that it is a "completely new application." Apparently that means it also has a no plug-in architecture, and many previously functioning plug-ins no longer work after the update. Fortunately, iMovie '06 will remain on your drive after installation of iMovie '08, so plug-ins can be used with the older version of the application.

The new release of iMovie '08 is a complete rewrite from the ground up and lacks the support for plug-ins. There are just a handful of transitions and titles, and no effects in this new version. It is nice if you need to create a very basic video quickly, but you will likely want to keep using iMovie 6 for most of your video projects. Fortunately, if you install iLife 08, a copy of iMovie 6 stays on your system.

Please bug Apple to update iMovie'08 to support third party plug-ins.

Apple News

Following are some "bites" from Apple News and other sources for you to chew on.

1. Rumor has it that - Apple and Volkswagen contemplate iCar.

Apple co-founder and chief executive Steve Jobs has reportedly met with Martin Winterkorn, chief executive at **Volkswagen AG**, to discuss a possible collaboration. A report in **Associated Press** suggests that the two chiefs have set up meetings to outline a car that would integrate Apple's technology. Both companies have a history of working to integrate computers and media players into cars. Aside from

partnering with Apple to support the iPod, Volkswagen has publicly shown an interest in **embedding ultra-mobile PCs** inside it's vehicles. The car maker has also been working with Google to create an in-car navigation system based on **Google Maps**.

2. Apple will launch ringtone sales through its Tunes store, reports said Friday. The service targets iPhone users and permits buyers to convert any portion of a song into a ringtone. The New York Post and the Los Angeles Times are reporting the announcement will coincide with Apple unveiling new iPods. Apple has scheduled a "special event" for Sept. 5. The move comes amid \$600 million in ringtone sales in the U.S. and \$3.5 billion worldwide, according to research estimates.

3. "If you install Boot Camp on a well-equipped Mac model, it can become a blazing fast Vista computer." That's what Walter Mossberg (Wall Street Journal) concluded after installing Vista and Boot Camp on a new iMac. Mossberg tested the iMac's performance "using Vista's built-in Windows Experience Index, a rating system that goes from 1 to 5.9, with scores above 3.0 generally required for full, quick performance. My iMac scored a 5.0, the best score of any consumer Vista machine I have tested." That score, he remarks, is "very impressive for a computer that wasn't designed with Vista in mind." [Aug. 23, 2007]

I guess Apple figured at some point we'd get tired of Control-Clicking, so in Mac OS X if you connect a two-button USB mouse to your Mac, the second button automatically becomes the "Control-Click" function (just like the PC's Right-click). When you Right-click with the two-button mouse it will bring up the contextual menus for the particular area you are in.
